Homily

Profession of Faith

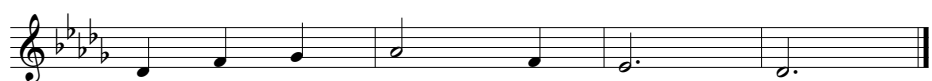

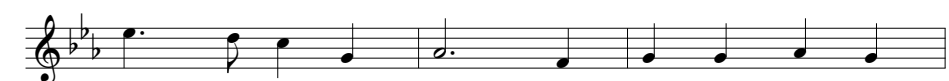
